#### **Climate:**

October, the same as September, is a moderately hot autumn month in Beirut, Lebanon, with an average temperature varying between 21°C (69.8°F) and 27.5°C (81.5°F).

An excellent water temperature of 26°C (78.8°F) and only 4 rainfall days, with 60mm (2.36") of accumulated rainfall, makes October a prime for swimming and other water activities.

In Beirut, the average high-temperature in October is relatively the same as in September - a still moderately hot 27.5°C (81.5°F). In October, in Beirut, the average low-temperature is 21°C (69.8°F).



## **Currency**

The Lebanese Lira (LBP) is the currency of Lebanon. However, USD can be paid in any store and for any service.

It is advised to have USD in cash since using cards is not an option.

## **Power plugs and sockets**

For Lebanon there are three associated plug types C, D and G. Plug type C has two round pins, plug type D is the plug which has three round pins in a triangular pattern and type G is the plug with three rectangular pins in a triangular pattern. Lebanon operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.

## **Dial code**

International dial code: +961
